

Luke 6:43-45 The Inside produces the Outside

Luke 6:43 "For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit, <u>44</u> for <u>each tree is known by its</u> <u>own fruit.</u> For figs are not gathered from thornbushes, nor are grapes picked from a bramble bush. <u>45</u> The good person <u>out of the good treasure of his heart produces good</u>, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for <u>out of</u> <u>the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks</u>.

The real work begins (Neh 8-13)...

- It is about their Relationship with God.
- They need Spiritual Renewal from inside out.
- What does Spiritual Renewal look like?
 - Hunger for the Heart of God (8:1-8)
 - Humbled by the Grace of God (8:9-12)
 - Honoured to be the People of God (8:13-18)

1. Hunger for the Heart of God (Neh 8:1-8)

- A collective hunger for God: "all the people"; "as one man"
- The Scriptures: Not just rules and regulations, but the story of how God has chosen them (since Abraham), delivered them (Moses) and taught them to live as His covenant people – God opening His heart.
- **Posture of reverence:** Ezra on a platform, the people standing; Ezra blessing the Lord, the people shouting "Amen, Amen", lifting their hands, bowing their heads and worshipping face down (vv.4-6).
- Desire to know God deeply: Levites explaining ("making plain").

2. Humbled by the Grace of God (Neh 8:9-12)

- Scriptures bring about spiritual awakening "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Tim 3:16)
- Collective lament over their unfaithfulness "all the people wept as they heard the words of the Law." (8:9)
- God's joy over their repentance gave them strength to rejoice "this day is holy to our Lord... do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength" (8:10)

3. Honoured to be the People of God (Neh 8:13-18)

- The Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot) restored
 - Living 7 days a year in temporary shelters, gathering for daily Scripture readings. To
 remember what it was like to live as
 homeless pilgrims as their forefathers were.
- Why was Sukkot neglected since entering the Promised Land: Productivity lost? Ridicule by others? Ashamed or bored with the past? Too troublesome? Or simply forgot?



3. Honoured to be the People of God (Neh 8:13-18)

- Hearing, weeping and rejoicing in God's grace is good...
- But obedience and practice is needed for the transformation of our spiritual identity.
- Deepening the foundations: how God remembered His promises, and with a mighty hand brought them from slavery into the Promised Land to become the People of God.



Luke 6:47-49 Hearing and obeying

Jesus said:

47 Everyone who comes to me and hears my words and does them, I will show you what he is like: 48 he is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when a flood arose, the stream broke against that house and could not shake it, because it had been well built.
