U.S., Russia Head for Showdown At Sea; Latins Back Blockade

WAITING FOR RUSSIANS U.S. Fleet Fans Over Sea

WASHINGTON (AP)—A mighty U.S. war fleet fanned across the Atlantic today, preparing to intercept a large number of Russian cargo ships possibly carrying more missiles to Communist Cuba.

The first contact could come by nightfall — and with it the first test of President Kennedy's newly proclaimed arms blockade on Fidel Castro's Cuba.

Large numbers of Soviet ships were reported moving in the direction of Cuba, but not in convoy.

Halt, Stop, Search or Slink Ordered

American Navy vessels sailed yesterday from the Puerto Rico area and East Coast ports.

Their orders: Halt, stop, search — and, if necessary — sink vessels which try to avoid inspection.

Ships of any nation — Communist and non-Communist alike — will be stopped by U.S. Navy ships if they are bound for Cuba.

And a Defense Department official made it quite clear that force will be used — regardless of the nationality of a ship — if it refuses to halt or follow any order to change course away from Cuba. That could mean ships

The great nuclear jet bombers of the Strategic Air Command and SAC's 344 combat-ready intercontinental ballistic missiles were placed on an increased alert.

U.S. ground, sea and air forces around the globe — including those in Berlin and West Germany — were also ordered to be especially vigilant.

There was no overt threat to the U.S. Naval Base on Guantanamo Bay in Eastern Cuba, but the United States got this vital outpost in fighting trim by shipping home an estimated 2,200 Navy wives and children and reinforcing the 3,300-man "Glimo" garrison of Navy men and Marines with perhaps 2,000 more Leathernecks.

Potential Hemisphere Dangers Show

The defense official, appearing last night at a packed briefing, made it plain that the drastic U.S. blockade action was triggered by confirmation that 1,200-mile-range mobile ballistic missiles were in place and actually threatening U.S. cities.

Kremlin Hums In Swift Reply To JFK Action

MOSCOW (UPI)—The Soviet Union charged today that the United States by blockading Cuba has taken "a step along the road of unleashing thermonuclear war."

In swift reaction to President Kennedy's blockade announcement, the Russians canceled all military leave, halted discharges from the military service and called a meeting of military officers of the Communist Warsaw Pact nations.

The Soviet Test News Agency said measures were being taken to increase troop and naval preparedness.

Prevention Claimed

Tass said the action was taken "in connection with the provocative actions of the American government and the aggressive intentions of the American militarists."

Soviet Bloc Ships Steam For Caribbean

Moscow Cancels Troop Leave; OAS Lauds JFK

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The United States and Russia headed toward a potentially explosive test today as Soviet bloc ships plowed through the Atlantic toward an American blockade against shipments of missiles and other aggressive weapons to Cuba.

The showdown could come before nightfall. Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara said last night that the U.S. blockades were expected to encounter the first Communist ships "within the next 24 to 48 hours."

There were three developments:

Hawaii — The Soviet Government ordered today the cancellation of all leaves of Russian military personnel and a halt to discharges from military service until further notice, the official news agency

U.S. Forces Ready For Berlin Threat

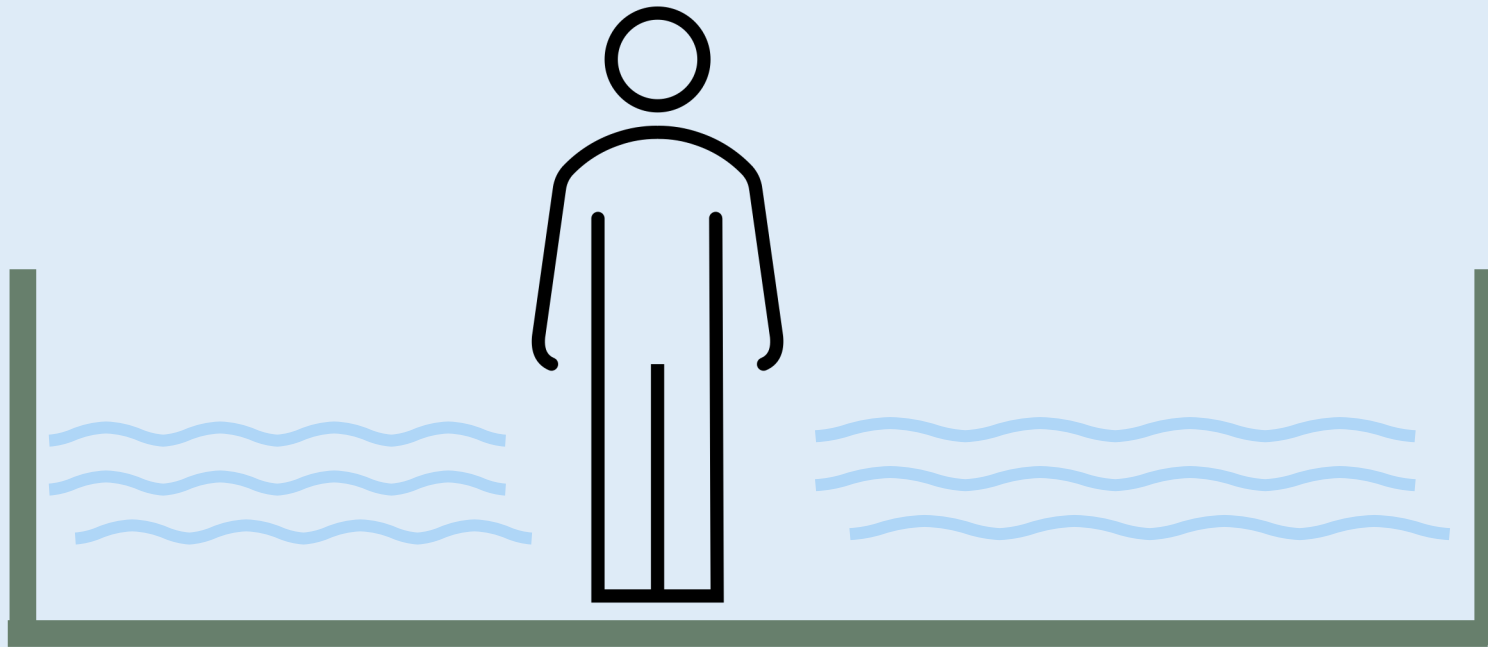

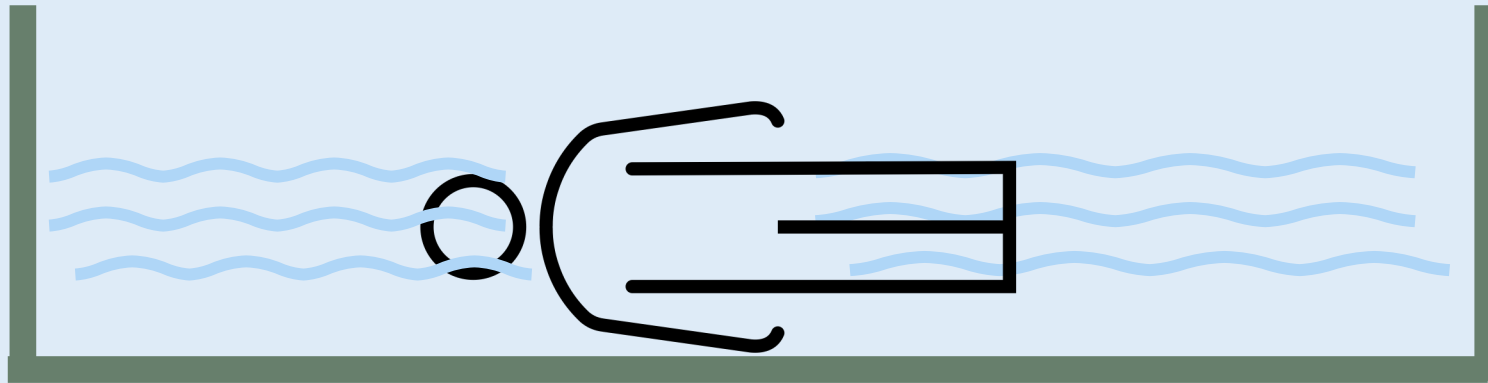
Baptism

Candidate who believes enters the water to be baptized.



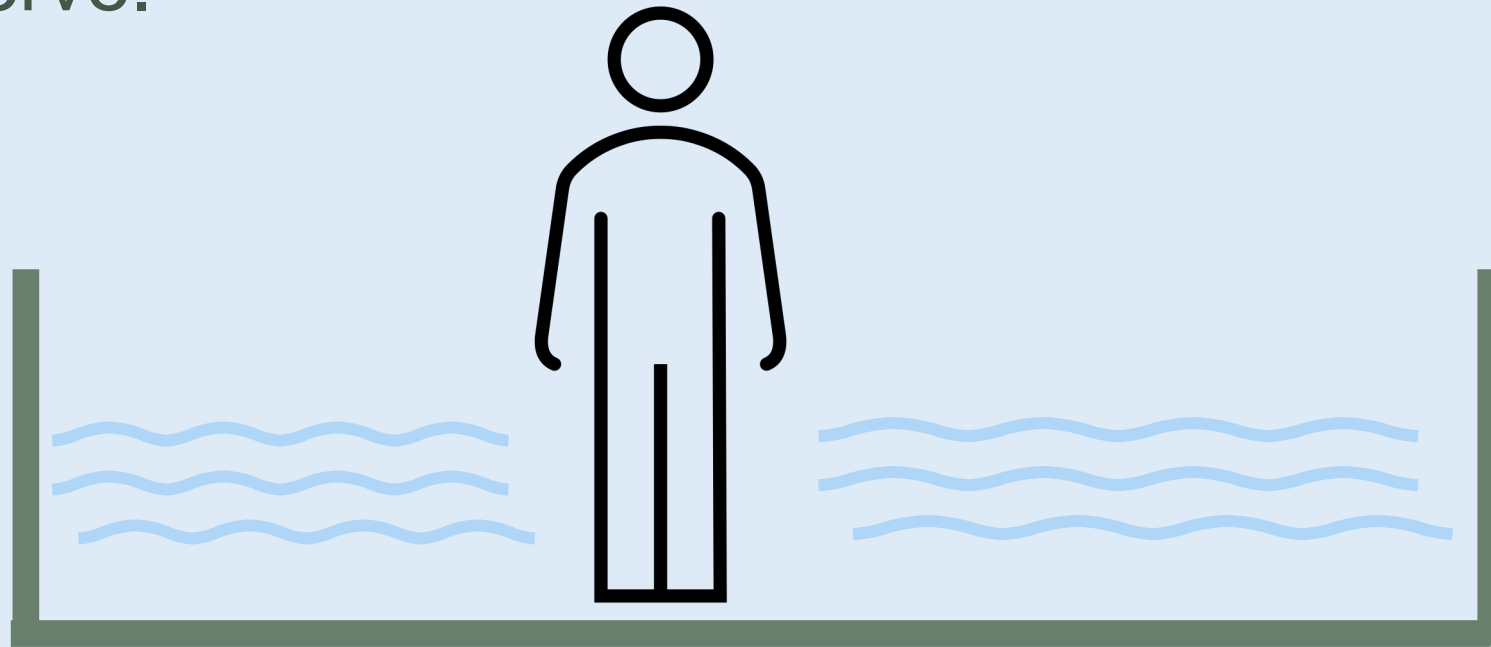
#1 - Crucified with Christ

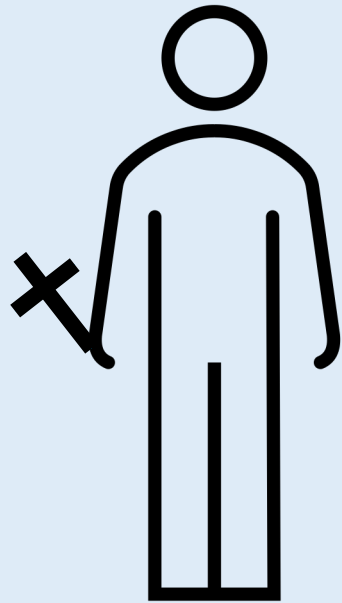
#2 – Resurrected with Christ
