- 2. Unpacking Matt 2:1-11 and Rev 13:1-10
- 2.1 Worship is innate in all humanity; there is nexception. (Matt 2:1-2)
- 2.2 Worship belongs to God, and God alone. (No.
- 2.3 True worship and giving (what's giving?) are intertwined. (Matt 2:11b)
- 2.4 The dragon, Satan, who craves for worship which belongs to God alone will induce (force) humanity to worship him. (Rev 13:1-4)
- 2.5 Humanity, by and large, will succumb to the coercion of 'the beast' and will worship it, and the dragon. (Rev 13:5-8)

- 2.7 The original language translated as 'worship' in the two sermons readings is proskuneo (G4352). What is proskuneo?

**Strong's Dictionary, G4352** – προσκυνέω (*proskuneō*)

From G4314 and probably a derivative of G2965 (meaning to kiss, like a dog licking his master's hand); to fawn or crouch to, that is, (literally or figuratively) prostrate oneself in homage (do reverence to, adore): worship.

**Total KJV occurrences: 60** 

#### **Thayer's Definition, G4352** – προσκυνέω (*proskuneō*)

- 1) to kiss the hand to (towards) one, in token of reverence
- 2) among the Orientals, especially the Persians, to fall upon the knees and touch the ground with the forehead as an expression of profound reverence
- 3) in the NT by kneeling or prostration to do homage (to one) or make obeisance, whether in order to express respect or to make supplication
  - 3a) used of homage shown to men and beings of superior rank
    - 3a1) to the Jewish high priests
    - 3a2) to God
    - 3a3) to Christ
    - 3a4) to heavenly beings
    - 3a5) to demons

(Part of Speech: verb)

- is the most common of half a dozen NT words translated as 'worship'; this is similarly so for the equivalent OT word (shachah, H7812).



- 3.1 is the most common of half a dozen NT were to the similar pattern for the equivalent OT word
- 3.2 Proskuneo appears 60 times in the NT; 11 times 24 times in the book of Revelation.
- 3.3 *Proskuneo*-worship is bowing down, prostrating, or kneeling before God as our act of worship, both in private and in public.



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- In the Second Commandment, we are specifically commanded not to shachah (i.e. proskuneo) before any idol. See Exodus 20:4-5.
- 3.5 *Proskuneo* shapes our humility and submission to God, His might and His majesty. *Proskuneo* is the much-needed antidote against pride.

#### 4. Conclusion: 'Proskuneo-Worship God!'

- 4.1 This *imperative* was given to John the Beloved an 'old Christian' not a newbie; we all can make mistakes! (Rev 22:8-9) Only 'the words of this book' can keep us from going astray.
- 4.2 'Worship God' is the full and ultimate measure of who and what we really are; we are NOT defined by our positions, fame, education, social standing, wealth, abilities, whatever, but by our worship of God.
- 4.3 *Proskuneo*-worship pleases God, because such worship is reflection of our genuine reconciliation with our heavenly Father.

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
