


2 KEYTHEMES

- God's Holy Presence
 - Now dwells in His people
 - We are now His spiritual temple
 - His holiness & our sin cannot co-exist in the temple



2 KEYTHEMES


- Satan's Strategy
 - He assaults the church & battles against the Holy Spirit
 - External: persecutions
 - Internal: corrupts the church through sin, divides through conflicts





The Sin that Corrupts
 The Self-Seeking who Cheats
 The Self-Giving Who Cares

- Ananias & Sapphira (5:1-11)
 - One of the most disturbing episodes, and a very troubling passage
 - Raises many theological questions about sin, judgment, God



- Sin (5:1-11)
 - What sin did Ananias & Sapphira commit that warrants a fatal punishment?



Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep back for yourself part of the proceeds of the land? While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, was it not at your disposal? Why is it that you have contrived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to man but to God."


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
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
- Sin (5:1-11)
 - What sin did Ananias & Sapphira commit that warrants a fatal punishment?
 - Issue is not about generosity but dishonesty
 - Lying, faking, misleading, deceiving others about their generosity: deliberate & pre-meditated



- Sin (5:1-11)
 - What sin did Ananias & Sapphira commit that warrants a fatal punishment?
 - Kept back: set aside for oneself secretly and dishonestly, associated with financial fraud & embezzlement, element of greed & cheating



- Sin (5:1-11)
 - What sin did Ananias & Sapphira commit that warrants a fatal punishment?
 - Lying not just to leaders & church but to God
 - Letting Satan fill their heart & influence them, instead of being filled with & moved by the Spirit




- Sin (5:1-11)
 - What sin did Ananias & Sapphira commit that warrants a fatal punishment?
 - Gone to the dark side: Satan gets us so obsessed with an idea or course of action that we get carried away & are blinded to the consequences (A Fernando)



• Judgment (5:1-11)


- Why is the punishment so harsh? Aren't Christians under the covenant of grace?
- Arguments: Ananias & Sapphira are not Christians, they died from natural causes (heart attack)



- Judgment (5:1-11)
 - Divine judgment: similar OT examples
 - Nadab & Abihu offered "strange" fire in tabernacle, irreverently and disrespectfully (Lev 10:1-2)
 - Among those who are near Me I will be sanctified, and before all the people I will be glorified (v3)




- Judgment (5:1-11)
 - Divine judgment: similar OT examples
 - Achan kept back spoils from Jericho against divine orders (Josh 7)




• Judgment (5:1-11)

- Divine judgment: a pattern?
- Nadab & Abihu: just after first setting up of the tabernacle
- Achan: just after Israel entered the Promised Land



• Judgment (5:1-11)


- Divine judgment: a pattern?
- God had to judge sin in a more severe manner at the beginning of a new period in the history of the people of God?
- Judgment on Ananias & Sapphira: start of early church, holiness & purity of community at stake



• Judgment (5:I-II)

- Divine judgment: testing the Spirit (5:9)

"How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit of the Lord?"




Peter is saying to Sapphira & Ananias that in spite of the evident presence in the church of the Spirit of the Lord, they had chosen to attempt to "pull a fast one" on God. Their lie contained within it the assumption that the Spirit would do nothing. Conscious or not, it was a challenge as to whether God was really present in the church. Will God respond, or will He turn a blind eye to their deception? This is a dangerous challenge. God responds, and they die.

• Judgment (5:1-11)

- Divine judgment: testing the Spirit (5:9)
- Result of judgment: great fear came upon the whole church and on all who heard about it (5:5, 11)



"Is he—quite safe? I shall feel rather nervous about meeting a lion." (Susan)

"If there's anyone who can appear before Aslan without their knees knocking, they're either braver than most or else just silly." (Mrs. Beaver)

"Then He isn't safe?" (Lucy)

"Safe? Who said anything about safe? Course He isn't safe. But He's good. He's the King, I tell you." (Mr. Beaver)

EXHORTATION

Don't "play play" with God. Don't put Him to the test. Fear Him and never forget that He is a holy God.

God is indeed good & merciful but don't take advantage or treat Him like we can fool Him or pull a fast one on Him.

And don't treat Him like He is blind or oblivious to the sins we have allowed in our life, or believe that He will close His eyes to whatever deeds of darkness we may be engaged in.






EXHORTATION

The reason we are not struck dead yet is due to His great mercy, but don't presume on His graciousness, and then choose to remain unrepentant.

If we continue to live a sinful life, then don't say that we have not been warned – He is not safe!


• Why

 - Character assassination & slander




- Dishonest means in the church
- What a US pastor did to get his book into the New York Times bestseller list so that he can refer to himself as a "New York Times bestselling author"




- It's Sad

- Barnabas (4:32-37)
 - Paul's partner in 1st missionary journey
 - Joseph, Levite from Cyprus (v36)
 - Apostles called him the son of encouragement




- Barnabas (4:32-37)
 - Acts 9: believed in Paul, cared
 & encouraged him
 - Acts II: brought Paul to Antioch, encouraged him in ministry
 - Sold his personal field: donated full proceeds voluntarily & selflessly



Hospitable Generosity

- Generosity that provides the needy with a welcoming break from worrying about their essential needs
- Generosity that makes recipients feel welcome into their caring embrace and feel well taken care of



Hospitable Generosity

- Hospitable Generosity
 - Cultivate a self-giving & caring heart that is
 - Always on the lookout for those with needs
 - Ready to respond hospitably and generously



We should not ignore the New Testament witness to the importance of the gift of hospitality (Rom 12:13; Gal 6:10; Col 4:10; Philem 22). Even if not sold so as to increase our giving to God's work, our homes and properties are not to be hoarded as if 'only ours'... A home is a gift from God which He wants us to invest in the interests of the kingdom of God. Jesus immortalized this ministry [when He said], 'I was a stranger and you invited Me in' (Matt 25:35).
