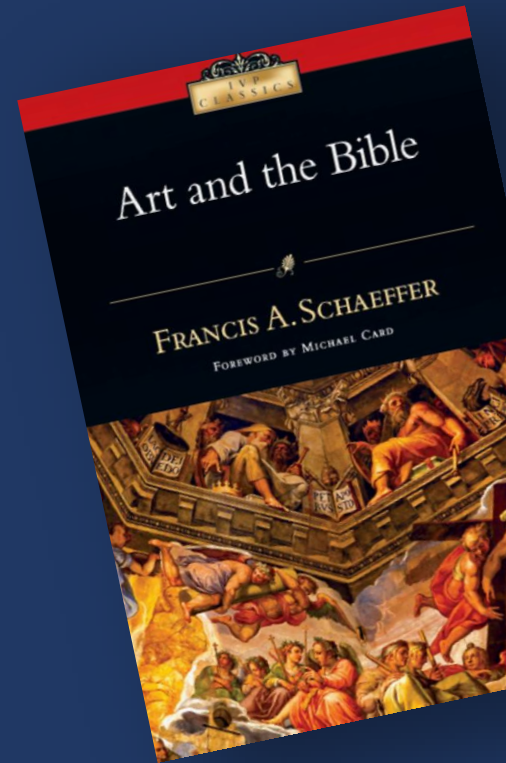
We turn minerals into paints—and paints into works that lift the heart or stir the spirit.
