### Jesus Shows His Scars

- To identify Himself

The scars on Jesus' hands and feet serve as a reminder of His sacrifice and the redemption He offers to believers. By seeing the physical evidence of Jesus' suffering, believers are reminded of the immense love and grace that Jesus has for them. The scars also tell the story of Jesus' victory over death and sin. By keeping the marks of His crucifixion, Jesus is demonstrating that even death and suffering could not defeat Him.



And one of the elders said to me, "Weep no more; behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that He can open the scroll and its seven seals." And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain... And He went and took the scroll from the right hand of Him who was seated on the throne. (Rev 5:5-7)

### Jesus Keeps His Scars

- To remind us that He is the crucified Saviour
- To tell the story of divine love written on human flesh
- To show that suffering and pain can be transformed



Resurrection means that even our wounds are made glorious because of the power of God. And our wounds can also testify and tell a story: this is where I suffered. This is where I hurt. This is where Jesus healed and offered comfort. This is where God redeemed my pain and suffering. Our wounds and our scars can tell stories that make Jesus' love and power visible to others. If we have courage to open our hands and show them... Words of an Easter hymn we sang on Sunday came to me as I prayed this morning: Crown Him the Lord of love; behold His hands and side, those wounds, yet visible above, in beauty glorified.
